**34th Annual Convocation
For the Priests in the Diocese of Norwich**

NEWPORT, RI.—The Annual Convocation for Priests will be held from November 30-December 2, 2015, at the Hyatt Regency Hotel on Goat Island in Newport, RI. It will be a time for all priests to gather with their bishop for spiritual renewal, support, education and rest. No parish, school or institutional activities will be scheduled during these days. Please pray for your priests, as they will be praying for you.

The theme of this year's Convocation is "The Melchizedek Project and Priestly Renewal."

Our key presenter will be Father Brett Brannen, Pastor of Most Blessed Sacrament Church in Savannah, Georgia. Father Brannen is widely known as a powerful speaker and an expert in priestly formation. He has given over 70 parish missions and retreats to seminarians, priests, and religious orders.
