FAST AND ABSTINENCE

These regulations unite the whole Catholic Church throughout the world in the Lenten journey of repentance and conversion of heart. Observed in a spirit of generosity, fast and abstinence remind us of our own frailty and make us more sensitive to the needs of others. Acts of penance find their completion in works of charity and justice.

Fasting: Those between the ages of 18 and 59 years old are obliged to observe the laws on fasting. Traditionally, to fast means limiting oneself to one full meal in the day and two smaller meals. The two prescribed days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence: The law of abstinence obliges all those who are over the age of 14. On days of abstinence meat is not eaten at any meal. The prescribed days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

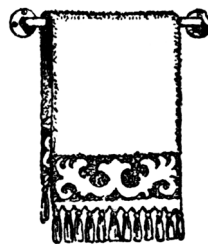

Lenten Reflection

It is Lent and we are challenged to better ourselves spiritually while at the same time being positive and grateful for the unconditional love we have all been given. What better way to do that than to look at the *Beatitudes*, those eight simple statements given to us by Jesus to help us live lives of loving service to God and one another.

For our purposes this Lent let's refer to those teachings as the BE-Attitudes!

This first full week of Lent we reflect on the first Beatitude: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Jesus is calling us to be "poor in spirit" but what does it mean to actually be spiritually poor? "Poor in spirit" happens when we recognize and accept that we have nothing and are nothing without God and His love; total surrender to our heavenly Father.

Unfortunately, most of us do not see many positives in doing this. We spend most of our days doing the opposite. Trying to handle everything on our own. We juggle work, family, hobbies, finances, caregiving, friends, exercise etc. leaving our relationship with God last on the list.

For most of us the outcome is the same- ultimately we fail. This failure comes in the form of sickness, exhaustion, addiction, alienation from others, depression, etc. When we leave God out of our lives, we leave out the one true source of our happiness/wholeness.

It's like trying to drive a car with no gas, it just does not work.

This Lent change that first Beatitude to your own personal Be-Attitude!

Be poor in spirit by thanking God for the many blessings you received throughout the day.

Be poor in spirit by reading a spiritual book/prayer/reflection instead of the newspaper.

Be poor in spirit by putting away your phone for a few hours to focus on the world around you.

Be poor in spirit by turning off your favorite tv show and acquiring a favorite saint to study.

Be poor in spirit by writing a prayer instead of a list of chores to do.

This Lenten Season if we share our *Be-Attitude* with everyone we come in contact with, our world will definitely be a better place!

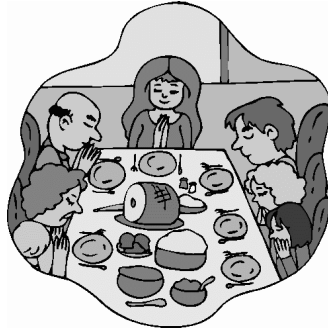
