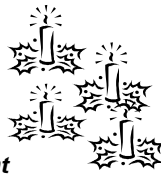

#### **Defending Our Religious Liberty Dec. 13, 2015**

Religious freedom is a cornerstone of our democracy. The federal health care mandate fundamentally alters the fragile balance between government and religious groups created by the framers of our Constitution. The same First Amendment that protects religious freedom protects freedom of the press. We wouldn't stand for the government telling news programs whom to interview or what articles to write.

If you haven't done so already, please voice your opposition to the federal health care mandate by calling U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Sylvia Mathews Burwell at 202-205-5445, and your elected representatives. Let them know that the mandate is in violation of our First Amendment right to religious freedom.

## PAVING UPDATE

Dear Parishioners:

At this time, I am pleased to give you a final reporting of our Paving Project. I am extremely pleased with your response to the needs of your parish. Through your generosity and dedication to Saint Francis Parish, we were able to take care of a major maintenance and liability issue.

By shortening the length of the parking lot and reconfiguring the placement of parking spaces, we were able to pave the drives up to the front of the Church. We did lose about 7-8 parking spaces overall but primarily due to the Handicap spaces in the back lot (4) and side lot (2) being striped to code. The other 1 -2 spaces were due to the 'shortening of the depth down along the side by the garage. The additional cost was \$13,000.00. This extra expense was approved by the Finance Committee. These particular sections of the drives were beginning to sprout potholes and crumbling.

At this point, we have completed the project. Left to do in the spring will be planting of grass and addressing the 3 inch drop at the back end of the parking lot.

Our pledge goal was \$67,000. To date parishioners have pledged \$ 61,625.00, leaving a pledge balance of \$ 5,375.00. If you have not made your pledge yet, please consider doing so.
