My dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On Italy's Day for Life in 2015, our Holy Father Pope Francis encouraged Christians to be faithful to their commitment to life and called all who embrace the mission of pro-life to "a renewed esteem of the human person and a more adequate care of life, from conception to natural death." Referring to the killing of unborn children, Pope Francis said that abortion is the result of "the selfishness of a culture that does not love life." Reaffirming the Church's position on reverence for all human life, Pope Francis noted the Church will never compromise on its opposition against abortion. "I want to be completely honest in this regard. This is not something subject to alleged reforms or modernizations. It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating human life."


Time after time, with the authority given it by Jesus Christ, the Church has reiterated its teaching that all human life is sacred and must be revered from conception to natural death. In its teachings and its witness, the Church embraces defenseless children waiting to be born as well all who inhabit this world with the tenderness of God's love. The Church preaches the Gospel of care and service, the Gospel of the works of mercy and compassion. "The works of mercy are the visible sign of our confession that the Son of God became flesh: visiting the sick, feeding the hungry, taking care of those who are abandoned: works of mercy.... The reason is because each of our brothers and sisters whom we must love is the flesh of Christ." (Pope Francis, January 7, 2016).

In this Great Jubilee of Mercy, works of mercy renew in us an awareness of God's presence in our lives and in the lives of our brothers and sisters, born and unborn. They not only express our love for God but also for those whom He has called to life. Today we live in a culture that denies the right to life to the most vulnerable among us, the defenseless unborn. We know all too well that similarly, the denial of the right to life for the frail elderly and the terminally ill threatens the very fiber of our society. The practice of the works of mercy is an effective means of bringing about change in our anti-life culture by changing the hearts of those who have grown callous and disregard the dignity and sacredness of all human life.

During this Jubilee of Mercy, as we approach the forty-third (43) anniversary of the legalization of abortion in our country, may we make the works of mercy a part of the practice of our faith and an example of our life in Jesus Christ, who came to us so that we might have life in abundance. May our witness to life make visible the

merciful love of God Whose only begotten Son gave His life for us and for our salvation. Through the intercession of Mary Virgin and Mother, may our words and our works speak of our resolve to protect, defend, and nurture all human life, born and unborn.
