

### Defending Our Religious Liberty Jan. 31, 2016

In early January, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops filed an amicus brief with the U.S. Supreme Court supporting Little Sisters of the poor and other ministries challenging the HHS mandate. The brief claims that the government is violating federal law by speaking for the sisters in saying that the accommodation provided is the mandate is compatible with their religious beliefs.

If you haven't done so already, please voice your opposition to the federal health care mandate by calling U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Sylvia Mathews Burwell at 202-205-5445, and your elected representatives. Let them know that the mandate is in violation of our First Amendment right to religious freedom.
