FAST AND ABSTINENCE

These regulations unite the whole Catholic Church throughout the world in the Lenten journey of repentance and conversion of heart. Observed in a spirit of generosity, fast and abstinence remind us of our own frailty and make us more sensitive to the needs of others. Acts of penance find their completion in works of charity and justice.

Fasting: Those between the ages of 18 and 59 years old are obliged to observe the laws on fasting. Traditionally, to fast means limiting oneself to one full meal in the day and two smaller meals. The two prescribed days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence: The law of abstinence obliges all those who are over the age of 14. On days of abstinence meat is not eaten at any meal. The prescribed days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

75% of monies donated are used for development projects overseas. 25% of the monies collected remain in our diocese.

Some of the 2015 grant recipients in our diocese were: **Outreach to Haiti Diocese of Norwich** – serves the people of Haiti in the spirit and values of the Gospel. Providing sacramental and spiritual support, it offers education, health care, parish twinning opportunities, and community development to benefit Haitians in need and hospitality to international volunteers and visitors. Malnutrition and food insecurity have a major impact on the lives of the children in Haiti. Most recently available statistics from UNICEF report that in Haiti, 20% of the children under five are moderately to severely malnourished, 10% experience moderate to severe wasting and 29% moderate to severe growth stunting. The immediate objectives of the Outreach nutrition program are to alleviate malnutrition in infants and children, to decrease the infant mortality, and to reduce the number of stunted children and children with grave disease. Outreach can accommodate 50 children and caregivers enrolled in and rotating through the program at one time. While the number of children served on an annual basis depends on how quickly children achieve normal weight, we estimate that 100 children will benefit from the program in any 12 month period.
