FAST AND ABSTINENCE

These regulations unite the whole Catholic Church throughout the world in the Lenten journey of repentance and conversion of heart. Observed in a spirit of generosity, fast and abstinence remind us of our own frailty and make us more sensitive to the needs of others. Acts of penance find their completion in works of charity and justice.

Fasting: Those between the ages of 18 and 59 years old are obliged to observe the laws on fasting. Traditionally, to fast means limiting oneself to one full meal in the day and two smaller meals. The two prescribed days of fasting are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence: The law of abstinence obliges all those who are over the age of 14. On days of abstinence meat is not eaten at any meal. The prescribed days of abstinence are Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday.

As announced last week, all our parishioners are invited to the consecration of the Chrism and the blessing of the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumens at the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, March 22, 2015, at 10:30 a.m. The Mass will be celebrated at the Cathedral of Saint Patrick in Norwich. Bishop Michael R. Cote will celebrate this liturgy. All are invited.

The Sacred Chrism, oil mixed with sweet perfume, symbolizes the presence of the Holy Spirit. It will be used in the parishes in the sacraments of baptism and confirmation. It is also used at the ordination of bishops and priests and at the dedication of a church and altar.

The Oil of the Sick is used to anoint those who are suffering from illness so that they may receive strength and healing, both physical and spiritual.

The catechumens will be anointed with the Oil of Catechumens in preparation for their baptism at the Easter Vigil.

The Chrism Mass is a celebration of the entire local Church, and the subsequent use of the oils in the various parishes is a sign of unity among God's people. Why not plan to take your family to the Cathedral that day? It is a very special experience!



Annually, the Easter Collection is taken up for sick and retired priests of our Diocese. In the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2015, the Easter Collection amounted to \$209,277. The Diocese spent \$289,447 for sick and retired priests. The money was spent for medical insurance for sick and retired priests, medical costs not covered by insurance, such as special housing needs, the cost of necessary extended stays in nursing homes after surgery, convalescent home care, counseling, residential care, and monthly compensation for priests on sick leave.

THE PRACTICE OF COVERING CROSSES AND IMAGES

Until recent time it was customary to veil prominent statues and crucifixes in church with a purple cloth as a sign of sadness and mourning. In some churches, beginning around 900, one large cloth was hung between the people and the altar from the beginning of Lent. This was done to hide the heavenly glory depicted by statues of saints and crosses with the figure of the triumphant Christ. This custom came to symbolize the exclusion of all sinners from the altar just as public sinners were excluded. Since the 1600's, this veiling was limited to Passiontide, beginning on the fifth Sunday of Lent, originally called "Passion Sunday". On that Sunday (today only in Cycle B), the final words of the Gospel are: "At that they picked up rocks to throw at Jesus, but He hid Himself and slipped out of the temple precincts" (J. 8:59). Crosses remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

Parishioners Are Invited To Bring Their Easter Food Baskets for the Blessing of Easter Food Baskets on Saturday April 4 at 1:00 pm at Saint Francis of Assisi Church (Gathering in the Church)

A traditional Polish Easter Basket would contain a small amount of the following:

- ❖ Butter (maslo) - This favorite dairy product is often shaped into a lamb or a cross. This reminds us of the goodness of Christ that we should have towards all things.
- ❖ Easter bread (babka) – A round loaf topped with a cross or a fish, symbolic of Jesus, who is the Bread of Life.
- ❖ Horseradish or pepper (chrzan/pieprz) – The bitter herbs of Passover and the Exodus, signifying first the bitterness of spiritual exile; second and more meaningfully, the bitterness of the sufferings of Our Lord Jesus.
- ❖ Eggs (jajka) decorated with symbols of Easter, life, and prosperity (pisanki) – Indicate new life and Christ's Resurrection from the tomb.
- ❖ Sausage (kielbasa) – A spicy sausage of pork products, indicative of God's favor and generosity.
- ❖ Ham (szynka) – Symbolic of great joy and abundance. Some prefer lamb or veal. The lamb also reminds Catholics that the Risen Christ is the "Lamb of God".
- ❖ Smoked bacon (slonina) – a symbol of the overabundance of God's mercy and generosity.
- ❖ Salt (sol) – So necessary an element in our physical life, that Jesus used its symbolism: "You are the salt of the earth".
- ❖ Cheese (ser) – Shaped into a ball, it is the symbol of the moderation that Christians should have at all times.
- ❖ Wine (wino) – Often added reminds us of the blood of sacrifice which Jesus Christ spilled for us on Calvary.
- ❖ Vinegar (ocet) – Reminds us of the gall (sour wine) which was given to Our Lord as he hung on Calvary.

A candle is inserted into the basket to represent Jesus, The Light of the World. A colorful ribbon and sometimes sprigs of greenery are attached. A linen cloth is drawn over the top and it is ready for the trek to church where it is joined with the baskets of others to await the blessing that will render it fit for consumption on Easter Sunday.
