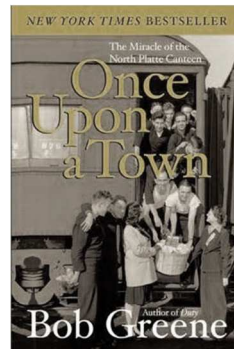

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I know from our many conversations across the Diocese, that you are keenly aware of the continuing need for more priests to meet the demands of our active faith community. I deeply appreciate your encouraging a culture of vocations.

We all contribute by praying for our future priests and supporting them in every way possible. I thank you for your very generous response to the *Annual Seminary Education Fund Appeal*. This year's appeal takes place in your local parish the weekend of May 6 – 7<sup>th</sup>. The young men discerning a commitment to the priesthood thank you for being there for them. They feel your strong support.

At this time last year, we had eleven men studying for the diocese, all at different points of the journey through formation. Four of those men I was blessed to ordain to the priesthood last June 25<sup>th</sup>. In turn, we are blessed by their service in the diocese.

Presently, we have two men who are in their philosophical studies, four in different years of major seminary, and two who are just now finishing up their two-year English programs before transitioning back to college undergraduate work and/or seminary work. Please pray for Mr. Frank Gilbert as he prepares for ordination to the transitional diaconate on June 8, 2017, at St. Mary of Czestochowa in Middletown CT.


I ask you to please also join me in praying for the ten other men in the diocese discerning a call to priesthood, and for others you may know or think should also discern God's call. Have you noticed priestly characteristics in a young man in your parish, your town community, or possibly even in your own son?
